Play it Safe in the Heat

Go early, wet, short, high. Ensure your walkers carry plenty of water, have sun protection and carry a pressure immobilisation bandage for snake bite. Don't hesitate to shorten or postpone an activity if conditions are extreme.

"Interested" Bookings

Do you receive Interested participants for your activities? I think what is happening, in some cases, is that a 'booking' is made when not logged on to Bilby. So they don't see Create a booking and can only communicate via the Ask a question about this activity! So

check all your Interested participant entries carefully to see what they mean.

LET'S GET TAGGING RIGHT!

You can send a private Note to any participant registered on your activity, be they Valid, Pending, Interested or Void. Because these are 1-to-1 notes, no tagging is necessary. Bilby sends an email alert to the recipient.

ALL OTHER NOTES SHOULD BE TAGGED.

Don't make up the tag. Select it from the @Mention dropdown list available in the Message Board. The simplest way to use multiple tags is to have each on a line by itself in the note. Bilby sends an email alert to the recipient(s).

If you don't tag a message, no Bilby alert is emailed and the intended recipient has no idea that there is a message for them.

Want your activity published pronto? Edit your activity and access the Administration tab (not the Admin function). Send a note to the Walks Sec by selecting John-Evans from the @Mention dropdown.

Add a bit of panache to your activity - Markdown Markup Language


If you want, add a bit of formatting to your activity description, Notes, etc. Start off simple and don't overdo it. There are some deets at https://www.markdownguide.org/basic-syntax/.

For example, try bolding text. Place two asterisks immediately before and immediately after the text, such as **This will be a very hard walk.**

Another good one is to specify an active URL link. The format is [text to display](URL), such as [load up the gpx file here](https://johnevans.id.au/GPX/2024-11-16-Camels-Hump-caching.gpx). Handy for a backup navigator.

Check that these work whilst your activity is still in Draft, so you don't look like a dill.
