@Tagging

Bilby can do all your emailing for you! No need to know participants' email address when you, say, communicate final trip arrangements. Use 1-to-1 Notes between you and a participant, or Message Board Notes with @tagging.

It works like this:

1-to-1 Notes. Navigate to the Details area for a participant on your activity. Fill in the Add a note for this participant Use Add Note. That's it! Bilby generates an email to the participant alerting them that there is a message for them.

Message Board Notes. Perhaps you've been surprised when, checking your activity's Message Board, you see a note from a participant. You received no Bilby alert. Why? The participant didn't @tag you! Similarly, you post a Message Board entry to participants and receive no reply. Did you @tag them? If not, they get no alert to your message. Solution – use @everyone or @[individual participant1] @[individual participant2] ... to generate Bilby alerts. Don't guess at the participant's userID – select the participant from the @ Mention drop down list of valid participants.
